## Classroom GAMES

These simple games are no-prep and can be used with worksheets in any subject!

## **Roll Your Score**

Students work with a partner in this game.

- When a student completes the question, their partner checks their work.
- If it is accurate, the student rolls two dice and adds them together.
- The number represents the points that the student earns for that problem.
- Now it is their partner's turn to work on the next question.
- Students will go back and forth until all of the questions are answered.
- Then, they add up their points to see who scored the highest.




This is a great game to play with table groups.


- Assign each group a color of sticky notes.
- Draw a 7X6 grid on your white board.
- Groups must work together to solve a problem on their worksheet.
- If their answer is accurate, they can put one of their team's sticky notes on the grid.
- The first team to get four of their sticky notes in a row on the grid is the winning team.

## **Random Numbers**

Students can work independently for this game.

- Display a hundreds chart on your white board.
- Students will work to complete questions on their worksheet.
- Once they have completed one (or more if you want), they come to you to have their answer checked.
- If it is accurate, they can write their name in one box on the hundreds chart.
- When you run out of time, use a random number generator app to pick a few numbers.
- If a student's name is on that number, they earn a prize or reward.















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
