# WEEKLY PLAN

### STUDENT DATA AND INTERVENTION

As students complete the biweekly assessments, it is important for both teachers and students to know what words were missed. This helps teachers to plan intervention and it helps students to focus their studies.

I make two copies of the data form for each student. I keep one copy in my student assessment binder. As I grade the assessments, I highlight any word that a student missed. If it is just a word or two- I am not too concerned. However, I may purposefully give that word to the student during the next social. If a student misses several words, I plan intervention time. This may be pulling a student or a small group of students to the back table during writing. It might be having a volunteer or aide work with a student or small group of students. (Consider having the group play the game with the cards for the words they missed.) If many students missed the same words, I will place those words in the extra practice center.

The second copy will be placed in a page protector in the students' binder or folder. When they get their assessment back, they will highlight any words that they got incorrect. If they finish something early, they will use their journal to review the incorrect words. If the page protector is placed in the binder, only his/her comments on

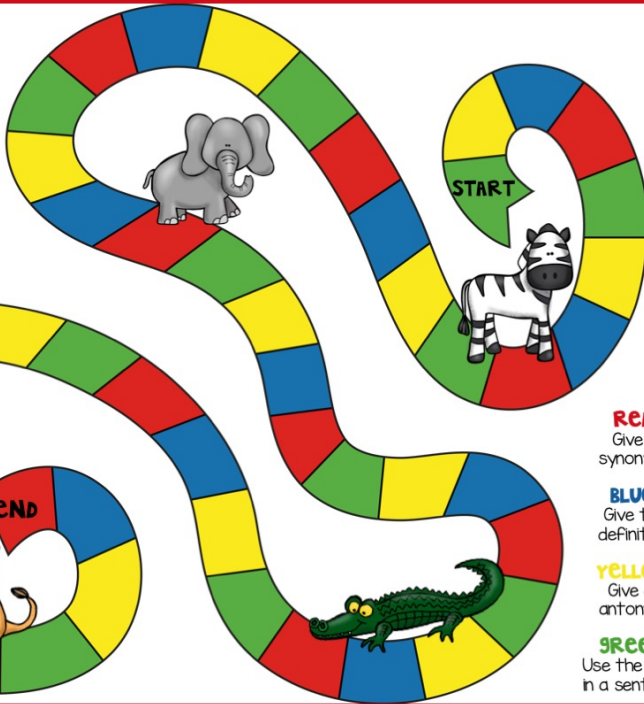
