

Relative Pronouns

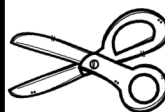
A relative pronoun comes after a noun to help identify which person or thing is being talked about or to tell more information about a person or thing.

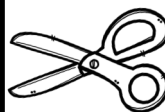

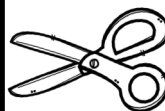

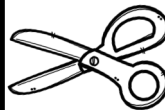
