Have you ever witnessed something that you thought was unfair and felt like you should do something to change it? That is how Cesar Chavez felt when he witnessed how poorly migrant workers were treated in the 1950s.

Growing up, Cesar's family fell on hard times and traveled around often as they looked for work in the fields. While working for farmers in the fields, Cesar watched as workers worked long hours with no breaks. They didn't have restrooms to use or any clean drinking water. Cesar knew that this was wrong and began leading nonviolent protests about this issue. He led boycotts and marches and gave speeches about the unfairness of how the workers were treated. In 1962, he started a union for migrant workers. This was a group of people who came together to try to better the working conditions for themselves and for others.

Over time, the union continued to grow. Over the decades they continued to fight for the rights of migrant workers to better their working conditions.

Cesar Chavez made a difference in the lives of migrant workers in the past, and his legacy still lives on today.
