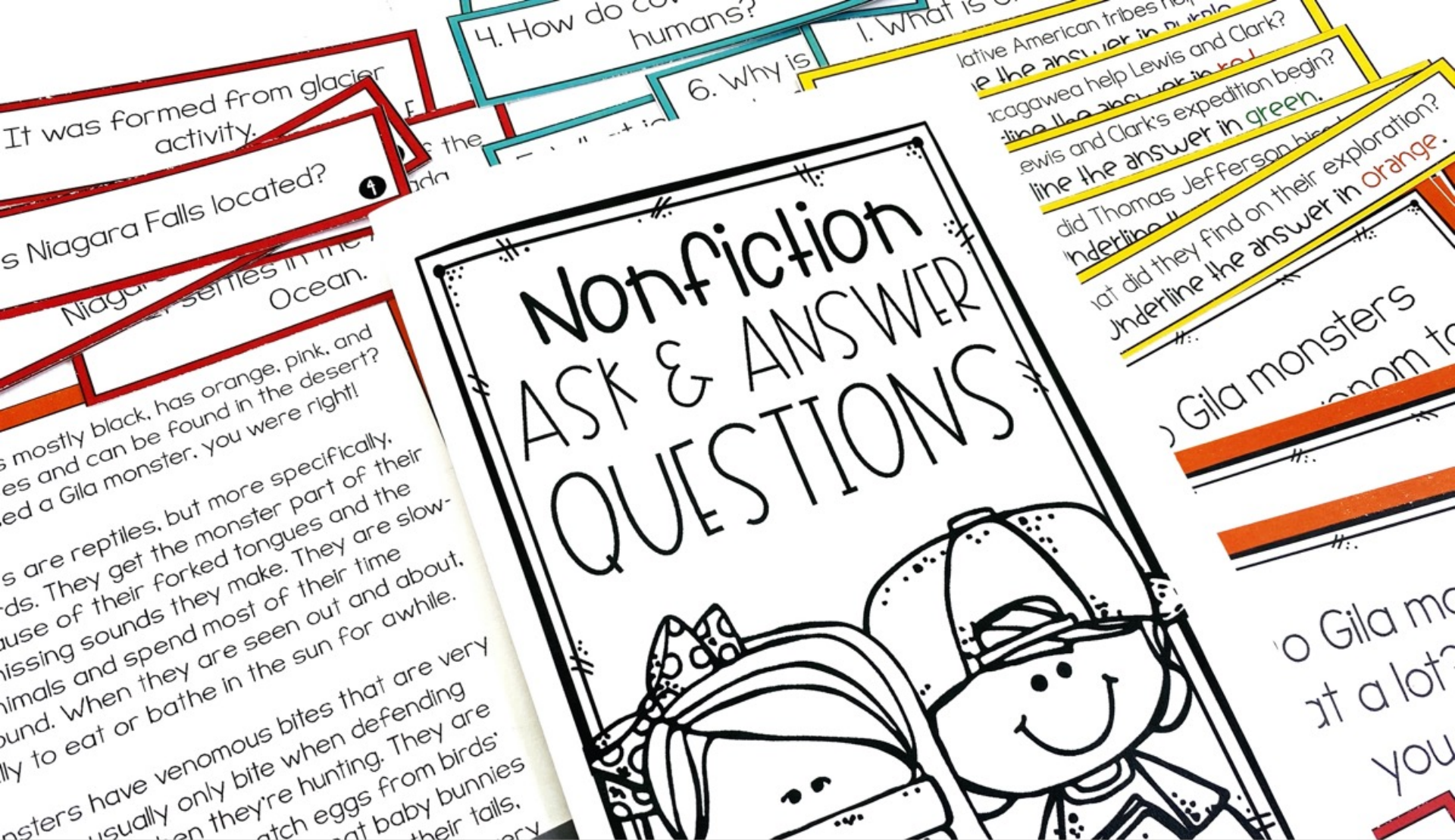
Have you ever witnessed something that you thought was unfair and felt like you should do something to change it? That is how Cesar Chavez felt when he witnessed how poorly migrant workers were treated in the PEOs.

Growing up, Cesar's family fell on hard times and traveled around often as they looked for work in the fields. While working for farmers in the fields, Cesar watched as workers worked long hours with no breaks. They didn't have restrooms to use or any clean drinking water. Cesar knew that this was wrong and began leading nonviolent protests about this issue. He led boycotts and marches and gave speeches about the unfairness of how the workers were treated. In 1962, he started a union for migrant workers. This was a group of people who came together to try to better the working conditions for themselves and for others.

Over time, the union continued to grow. Over the decades they continued to fight for the rights of migrant workers to better their working conditions.

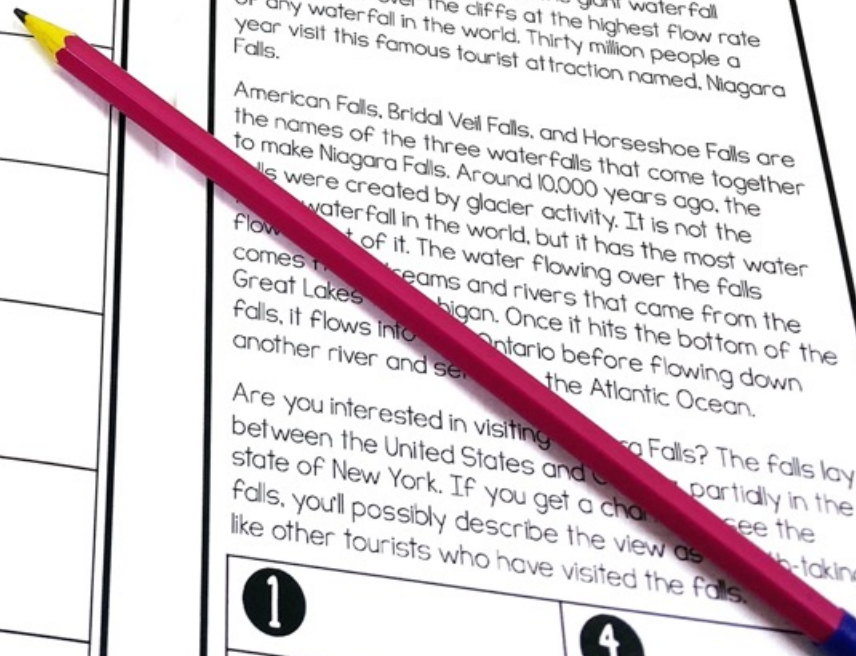

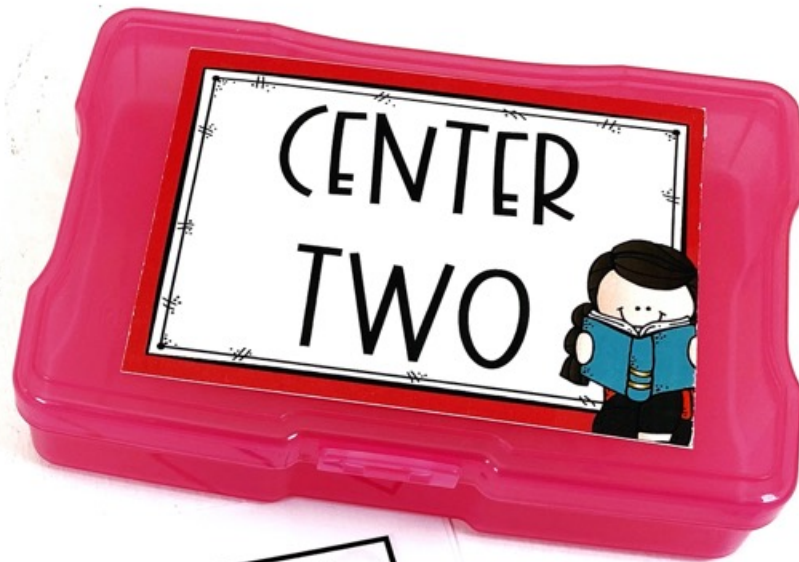

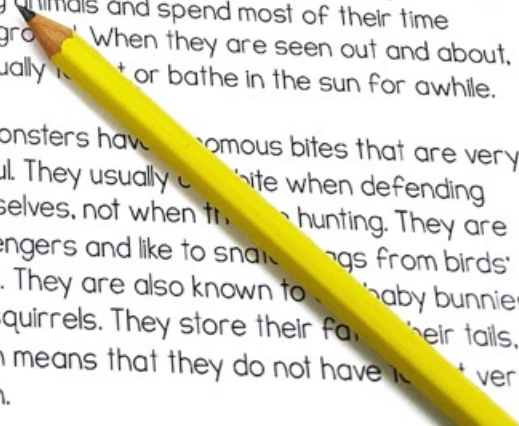
What do Gila monsters eat?

Each year, 3.5 million people visit the Empire State Building in New York City. Was this the goal of the architects who constructed this historical landmark? During the 1920s, competition between architects began as they raced to see who could build the tallest skyscraper in the Big Apple. In 1929, a couple of popular companies, General Motors and the Chrysler Corporation, started off the competition.

Blueprints of the Empire State Building took only 2 weeks to sketch, and construction began in September of 1929. The Empire State Building employed over 3,400 workers. They were mainly people who had come to America from Europe. The Chrysler Corporation was not giving away any hints. They kept their plans under wraps. The vice president of General Motors was not going to take any chances at having a shorter skyscraper, so he asked his architect to add a "hat" to the Empire State Building. This resulted in the architect adding a spire, or cone-like structure, to the design. This brought the building to 1,454 feet with 102 floors.

General Motors crossed the finish line in record time, completing construction in less than two years. On May 1, 1931, General Motors made history constructing the Empire State Building. Historically, this event is known as a true American accomplishment.
